Admission of an Out-of-State Attorney to practice Pro Hac Vice

An attorney who is not a member of the Virginia State Bar, but is currently licensed and authorized to practice law in another state, territory or possession of the United State of America may apply to appear as counsel *pro hac vice* in a particular case in association with a member of the Virginia State Bar (local counsel).
